For funded services in your county, participants need to have eligibility through the Department of Mental Health (DMH). If you don't have this already:

- Speak with a DMH Intake Officer at the Regional Center (314-587-4800) and complete an application
- DMH will follow up for you to complete an eligibility assessment
- If deemed eligible, receive a DMH ID number, which also makes participants eligible for Pathways' funded services
